BIBLE CURRICULUM (HS)

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- ▶ *Christian Living* is a study on the letters Paul wrote to the early churches. Students learn to apply these truths to their lives through Scripture reading, class discussion, and writing assignments. Teachers present all topics from a Biblical Worldview. Activities and assignments include explanatory papers, application essays, and a service-project proposal. Educators design these activities to meet the needs of students' varying learning styles.

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- ▶ This course introduces students to the concept of worldview, and what it means to have a biblical worldview. The goal of the course is to prepare students to *“always be ready to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope you have” (1 Peter 3:15)*. The course is divided into five units in order to solidify students’ knowledge and defense of the biblical worldview. Students look at the importance of understanding their faith, examining areas such as the rationality of Christianity and the existence of God. A study of the Scriptures is used to gain insight into the scientific and historical reliability of the Bible. Students use Scripture to study Creation in contrast to evolution focusing on the fallacies. Students also analyze arguments against Jesus Christ and evaluate Scriptures that support the deity of Christ, so that they are able to explain that Jesus Christ is exactly who He said He was. Finally, students briefly examine major world religions in comparison to Christianity to understand and analyze what these religions lack and what makes Christianity true.
